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The Missouri Veterans Commission (MVC) is a state agency established by Missouri Statute to aid all Veterans, their dependents, and legal representatives by providing information regarding the rights of Veterans and their dependents and to assist Veterans accessing their available benefits through State and Federal Government.

### **Our Mission**

The Missouri Veterans Commission will provide our Veterans with timely benefits assistance, skilled nursing care and a final resting place with honor.

### **Our History**

Missouri has a long tradition of honoring and serving its Veterans. This tradition started in 1897, when the State took over operations of the Federal Soldiers Home in St. James and the Confederate Soldiers Home in Higginsville. These homes were initially managed by the Board of Eleemosynary Institutions, and later by the Department of Health and Welfare until 1950 when the Confederate Home closed, and 1974 when the Federal Home in St. James was transferred to the Division of Veterans Affairs.

The Missouri Veterans Commission has its roots in the passage of House Bill 493 which in 1931 established the first State Service Officer. Over the years, this office has expanded and changed from one Service Officer, to the Division of Veterans Affairs after World War II, to its replacement by the 1989 creation and establishment of the Missouri Veterans Commission.

Today, the Missouri Veterans Commission manages seven long term skilled nursing homes, six state Veterans cemeteries, provides benefits assistance through its Service Officers, assists Veterans through an Ombudsman program and has initiatives for Veterans Outreach, Minority Veterans, Women Veterans, and Incarcerated Veterans.

Veterans Service Officers (VSO) are located throughout the state and can assist you if you are a Veteran, widow/widower of a Veteran, child of a deceased or disabled Veteran, or a parent who has lost a son or daughter in military service.

Service officers provide counseling and assistance when you have questions about compensation, pensions, education benefits, life insurance, medical benefits, state benefits, and burial benefits.

These trained professionals will also assist with completing and submitting claims applications to make sure all necessary documentation is attached.


A VSO will maintain your casefile and is always available to provide information, referrals, and advocate on your behalf.

Inside each region, service officers have a coverage area, usually defined by county, with a home office and possibly one or more outreach locations.

Have you recently returned from military service? If you've served, you've earned benefits. Now is the time to take advantage of the benefits VA offers OEF/OIF Veterans.

### Do You Want to Go Back to School?

VA pays benefits to eligible Veterans, reservists and active duty service members while they are in an approved education or training program.

### Are You Looking for a Good Job?

Take advantage of the variety of resources that can help you land one.

### 5 Years of Cost Free Health Care

OEF/OIF combat Veterans can receive cost free medical care for any condition related to their service in the Iraq/Afghanistan theater for five years after the date of their discharge or release.

### 180 day dental benefit

OEF/OIF combat Veterans may be eligible for one-time dental care — but you must apply with 180 days of your separation date from active duty.

### Find Family Support at Vet Centers

If you have served in ANY combat zone, local Vet Centers can help you and your family with readjustment counseling and outreach services — for free.

The VA Loan Guaranty Service within the Veterans Benefits Administration is charged with the responsibility of administering the home loan program. Our mission is to help veterans and active duty personnel purchase and retain homes in recognition of their service to the Nation. VA provides a Medical Benefits Package to all enrolled Veterans. This comprehensive plan provides a full range of preventive outpatient and inpatient services within VA health care system. Also, once you enroll in the VA's health care system, you can be seen at any VA facility across the country.

VA operates an annual enrollment system that helps to manage the provision of health care by providing an overall population of beneficiaries. Additionally, the enrollment system ensures that Veterans who are eligible can get care and ensures that care is given to Veterans who are eligible. VA applies a variety of factors in determining Veterans' eligibility for enrollment, but once a Veteran is enrolled, that Veteran remains enrolled in the VA health care system.

There are many ways that a Veteran may qualify to receive top-notch VA health care at over 1,400 medical centers and clinics across the nation. The VA has highly trained physicians and clinicians that allow the VA to address many specialties. You may also be able to receive assistance with prescription medication. VA health care is portable. Once enrolled, you may receive care at your home facility as well as the nearest VA facility while traveling.

## Missouri VA Vet Centers

Vet Centers are run by the VA separate from the better-known medical centers. Vet Centers guide Veterans and their families through some of the major adjustments in lifestyle that can occur after combat and are designed to help all Veterans, including those newly returned from Iraq and Afghanistan as well as those from Vietnam, Korea and even World War II.

Vet Center services include individual and group counseling in areas such as Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), alcohol and drug assessment, suicide prevention referrals, bereavement counseling, VA benefits assistance, employment counseling, information on community resources and educational opportunities.

## Missouri State Veterans Cemeteries

The Missouri Veterans Commission created a network of Veterans cemeteries so that every Missouri Veteran will have reasonable access to a Veterans cemetery. Five cemeteries are in operation at this time; Springfield, Higginville, Bloomfield, Jacksonville and Fort Leonard Wood. A sixth Veterans cemetery is located at the St. James Veterans Home, but is not open for interment.

There is no charge for any of the services provided. These services include opening and closing of the grave, provision of a concrete grave liner, upright granite headstones, full military honors for the Veteran, and perpetual care. Those who choose cremation have the choice of in-ground burial or placement within a columbarium niche. Pre-registration for future planning purposes is also available for Veterans and their eligible family members.

Veterans, spouses, and dependent children may be eligible for burial and cemetery benefits by the State of Missouri and the Federal Government.

Families should make these VA and State burial benefits arrangements through their funeral provider as neither the VA nor the State of Missouri make funeral arrangements or perform cremations.

Any item or service not listed in the following sections obtained from a funeral home will be at the families expense. Please contact a State or National Veterans Cemetery for a full listing of state and federal burial benefits that are provided at no cost.

## **Eligibility**

To be eligible for burial in a National or State Veterans Cemetery, the Veteran must have been:

- Discharged from active duty under conditions other than dishonorable.
- Have completed the required period of service as required by law.
- Members of the Reserve or National Guard also qualify for interment if they are eligible for retirement pay as a result of 20 years creditable service.
- There is no residency requirement for interment in a Missouri Veterans Cemetery.
- U.S. Citizens who served in the armed forces of a government allied with the United States during wartime may also be eligible.

# Federal Burial Benefits

## Burial in a National or Missouri State Veterans Cemetery

Burial benefits available include a gravesite in national or state cemeteries with available space, opening and closing of the grave, perpetual care, a Government headstone or marker, a burial flag, and a Presidential Memorial Certificate, at no cost to the family. Cremated remains are buried or inurned in national and state cemeteries in the same manner and with the same honors as casketed remains.

Burial benefits available for spouses and dependents buried in a national or state cemetery include burial with the Veteran, perpetual care, and the spouse or dependents name and date of birth and death will be inscribed on the Veteran's headstone, at no cost to the family. Eligible spouses and dependents may be buried, even if they predecease the Veteran.

## Burial in a Private Cemetery

Burial benefits available for Veterans buried in a private cemetery include a Government headstone or marker, a burial flag, and a Presidential Memorial Certificate, at no cost to the family. Some Veterans may also be eligible for Burial Allowances. There are no federal benefits available to spouses and dependents buried in a private cemetery.

## Burial Allowance

In certain circumstances, a Burial Allowance is available from the Veterans Benefits Administration. VA burial allowances are partial reimbursements of an eligible Veteran's burial and funeral costs. Please contact your funeral service provider or a Veterans Service Officer for more information.

## What are Military Funeral Honors?

The ceremonial paying of respect and the final demonstration of the country's gratitude to those who, in times of war and peace, have faithfully defended our Nation. The military funeral honors ceremony consists of, at a minimum, the folding and presentation of the American flag and the sounding of Taps by a detail of two uniformed members of the Military Services. Missouri Veterans normally receive a Three-Volley Rifle Salute, sounding of Taps, Flag Folding and Presentation. Active duty members and military retirees are entitled to additional honors.

## Who can receive Military Funeral Honors?

Deceased Active Duty, Guard and Reserve Members, Military Retirees, and Veterans who served at least one term of enlistment and separated under honorable conditions are eligible for Military Funeral Honors.

Military Funeral Honors will be denied to any person discharged under other than honorable conditions, convicted of a state or federal capital crime, or when circumstances surrounding the person's death are such that to provide honors at the funeral or burial of the person would bring discredit upon the military services.

## How do I request Military Funeral Honors and how much will it cost?

Request Military Funeral Honors through your Funeral Director. Military Funeral Honors are provided at no cost to you or the Funeral Home.

**How do I get a flag for the casket and how much will it cost?**

Request a flag through your Funeral Director.  
Flags are provided at no cost to you or the Funeral Home.

**What if we do not want Taps?**

The family decides whether or not Taps is provided.

**Who provides Military Funeral Honors?**

The family determines who presents the flag and can choose between Uniformed Service Members or a Veterans Service Organization. The Military Funeral Honors Program or Active Component determines who will provide the rest of the team based on availability of teams. Honors may be provided by any combination of Missouri Army and Air National Guard members, Active Duty Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, or Coast Guard, Retired Military Members, or Veterans Service Organizations.

## Flying Flags at Half-Staff

The United States flag and the Missouri state flag are flown at half-staff on the day of interment ceremonies for Veterans held in a Missouri State Veterans Cemetery and National Cemeteries.

## Senior Executive Services Members

Individuals holding or having held an office listed in 5 USC 5312 or 5313 (Levels I and II of the Executive Schedule) may qualify for interment in Arlington National Cemetery with approval by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs.

Burial will be conducted in the same manner as a dependent burial. No military honors will be rendered but pall bearers and a chaplain will be provided. If burial will be in a private cemetery, no marker, flag, or military funeral honors will be authorized.

Burial in a State Veterans Cemetery will not be allowed unless approved by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs. (NCA Directive 3210, Section III d) (Authority 38 USC 2402(6)) If approved, no military funeral honors will be provided.

## Child Custody & Visitation

If a deploying military parent is to be separated from a child, a court shall not enter a final order modifying the terms of custody or visitation until 90 days after the deployment ends unless there is a written agreement by both parties. Deployment or future deployment shall not be the sole factor to support a permanent modification of the custody or visitation terms established in an existing order.

A custody or visitation order may be temporarily modified to make reasonable accommodation due to the deployment, including visitation during deployment and when there is leave time for the deploying parent and shall automatically end no later than 30 days after the return of the deploying parent and the original order at the time of deployment is automatically reinstated.

The non-deploying parent must provide written notice to the court and to the deploying parent any change of address and contact information within seven days, except in instances where there is a valid order of protection in effect requiring the confidentiality of the non-deploying parent's contact information. In such instances the information shall only be given to the court.

The court may conduct an expedited or emergency hearing within 10 days of the filing of a motion regarding custody or visitation upon return of the deploying parent alleging an immediate danger or irreparable harm to the child. The non-deploying parent shall bear the burden of showing that reentry of the custody or visitation order in effect before the deployment is no longer in the child's best interests.

A deploying parent or a family member of a deploying parent with his or her consent may delegate the visitation rights to a family member with a close and substantial relationship to the minor child or children for the duration of the deployment if it is in the best interest of the child.

A deploying parent is required to provide a copy of his or her orders to the non-deploying parent promptly and without delay prior to the deployment.

A court cannot count any time periods during which the deploying parent did not exercise visitation due to military duties when determining whether a parent failed to exercise such rights. Also, any absence of a child from the state during a deployment after an order for custody has been entered must be denominated as a temporary absence for the purposes of the Uniform Child Custody Jurisdiction and Enforcement Act.

# Child Support

## **Review and Modification**

If you experience a change in your income as a result of being called to active duty, you may request that CSE modify your child support.

A custodial parent or noncustodial parent who has been called to active duty for a period of more than 30 days may request a review and modification due to an income change. The income change is considered a substantial change in circumstances for purposes of review and modification. That means CSE will complete a review of the order regardless of the age of the order and complete a modification regardless of whether the new amount differs by 20 percent from the existing obligation.

If you request a review of your order and a modification, please include a copy of your latest leave and earning statement, and a copy of your orders to appear for active duty.

Send your written request and documentation to the CSE office that handles your case.

## **Income Withholding**

If you have experienced a change in your income and have an obligation to repay past-due support, you may request that CSE adjust your past-due payment amount.

To request a change in your periodic past-due payment amount, send a written request, along with your latest leave and earning statement and orders to appear for active duty to the CSE office that handles your case. If appropriate, we will revise the amount being withheld to repay past-due support.

## **Children's Health Care Coverage**

If you are ordered to provide health care coverage for your child(ren) and have not done so, CSE will ask the military to enroll the child(ren) in the appropriate health care plan.

## **The Montgomery GI Bill**

The Montgomery GI Bill (MGIB) is available for those who enlist in the U.S. Armed Forces. MGIB encompasses both the Montgomery GI Bill-Active Duty (Chapter 30) and The Montgomery GI Bill-Selected Reserve (Chapter 1606).

## **The Post-9/11 GI Bill**

The Post-9/11 GI Bill provides financial support for education and housing to individuals with at least 90 days of aggregate service on or after September 11, 2001, or individuals discharged with a service-connected disability after 30 days. You must have received an honorable discharge to be eligible for the Post-9/11 GI Bill.

## **Reserve Educational Assistance Program (REAP)**

This program makes certain reservists who were activated for at least 90 days after September 11, 2001 either eligible for education benefits or eligible for increased benefits.

## **Survivors & Dependents Assistance (DEA)**

Dependents' Educational Assistance provides education and training opportunities to eligible dependents of certain Veterans. The program offers up to 45 months of education benefits. These benefits may be used for degree and certificate programs, apprenticeship, and on-the-job training. If you are a spouse, you may take a correspondence course. Remedial, deficiency, and refresher courses may be approved under certain circumstances.

### **Exemption from Proof of Residency for Students**

If the family of a student living in Missouri moves to live with other family members or live in a military family support community because one or both of the child's parents are stationed or deployed out of state or deployed within Missouri under Title 32 or Title 10 active duty orders, the student will be considered to have proof of residency and may attend the school district in which the family member's residence or family support community is located. If the active duty orders expire during the school year, the student may finish the school year in that district.

### **A+ Schools Program**

A student who is an active-duty military dependent is exempt from the three-year attendance requirement for the A+ Schools Program. In addition, a dependent of a retired military member who relocates to Missouri within one year of the date of his or her parent's retirement from active duty is be exempt from the attendance requirement.

### **Operation Recognition (Honorary High School Diploma)**

The Missouri legislature created Operation Recognition in order to provide honorary high school diplomas for Veterans and civilian prisoner of war (POWs) who left high school before graduation to serve in the military.

Eligibility: All civilian POWs who are residents or former residents of the state of Missouri and all honorably discharged Veterans who are residents or former residents of the state of Missouri who served in the United States military and who did not return to school and complete their education after their term of service shall be eligible to receive an honorary diploma. Family members may apply for the honorary diploma on behalf of a deceased Veteran.

Candidates must submit an application to the Missouri Veterans Commission. Application form is available from the commission, Veterans' organizations and local school officials.

## **Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children**

Children of families in the military often face educational barriers due to their parents' deployment or frequent moves. The educational records and enrollment procedures for children of military families transferring to/from Missouri fall under the guidelines of the Interstate Compact, Section 160.2000 RSMo.

The Interstate Compact allows a military dependent who has completed an accredited prekindergarten program or completed or attended a kindergarten program in another state to enter kindergarten or first grade even if the child has not reached the required age for Missouri schools by August 1, 2008. It also allows school districts to accept a course in government completed in another state when a student transfers to a Missouri high school in ninth to twelfth grade to satisfy the state's graduation requirement.

### **Missouri Returning Heroes' Education Act**

This act limits the tuition to no more than \$50 per credit hour at public colleges and universities while enrolled in an undergraduate certificate or degree program after all other financial aid is taken into account.

Eligibility: Applicable to combat Veterans who served after September 11, 2001. Veteran remains eligible for ten years after honorable discharge.

### **Academic Credit for Military Courses**

All public universities, colleges, vocational and technical schools in Missouri must award credits to an enrolled Student Veteran for equivalent courses that were part of the student's military training or service if the courses meet certain standards for academic credit.

### **In-State Tuition Eligibility for Discharged Service Members**

Anyone separating from the U.S. military service with an honorable or general discharge who declares presence and residency in Missouri will be considered a resident of Missouri for admission purposes and tuition at approved public four-year and two-year institutions of higher education. If attending a community college, presence within the taxing district of the community college must also be declared.

### **In-State Tuition Eligibility for Military Dependents**

A dependent of an active duty military member, as defined in federal law, who is residing in Missouri and whose parent is assigned to permanent duty in the state is eligible for in-state tuition as long as he or she is continuously enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate degree program of a Missouri higher education institution including any transfers from one Missouri institution to another or from an undergraduate to a graduate degree program.

### **In-State Tuition Eligibility for National Guard and Reserve Members**

RSMo 173.1153

Current members of the Missouri National Guard and members of a reserve component of the Armed Forces of the United States will receive in-state residency status for the purposes of tuition at any public four-year institution of higher education, or in-district residency status for any two-year public institution.

### **Higher Education Tuition Refunds when Called to Active Duty**

Students at public higher education institutions who are members of the armed forces reserves and are called to active service under certain circumstances are eligible for tuition refunds or for a grade of "incomplete." Students who are members of the National Guard are similarly eligible for the refunds or grade.

### **Bright Flight Scholarship Status when Called to Active Duty**

If a Bright Flight Scholarship recipient cannot attend an approved institution because of military service in any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States, the student will be offered the scholarship if he or she returns to full-time status within six months after ending the military service and verifying to the Coordinating Board of Higher Education that the service was satisfactorily completed

**War Veteran's Survivor Grant Program**

The War Veteran's Survivor Grants are available annually to children and spouses of Veterans whose deaths or injuries were a result of combat action or were attributed to an illness that was contracted while serving in combat action, or who became 80% disabled as a result of injuries or accidents sustained in combat action since September 11, 2001. The total number that may receive a grant in any year is limited by statute to 25. The Veteran must have been a Missouri resident when first entering the military service or at the time of death or injury. Please visit the listed website above for more information and eligibility requirements.

**Vietnam Veteran Survivor Grant Program**

Up to 12 grants are available annually to children and spouses of Vietnam Veterans who served between 1961 and 1972 and whose deaths were attributed to, or caused by, exposure to toxic chemicals during the Vietnam conflict. The Veteran must have been a Missouri resident when first entering the military service and at the time of death.

Eligibility: To be eligible as an initial or renewal student, you must:

- Be enrolled or accepted for enrollment as a full time (12 credit hours) undergraduate student at a participating Missouri postsecondary school. Students with disabilities may be considered full-time when enrolled in at least six credit hours.
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress as defined by the school.
- Be a United States citizen or permanent resident.
- Not be pursuing a degree or certificate in theology or divinity.
- Not have received a bachelor's degree, completed 150 semester credit hours, or received the award for 10 semesters, whichever occurs first.

If you are a dependent child, you will remain eligible through the semester in which you turn 25 if you have not already reached the limitations described and if you are a spouse, you will remain eligible through the semester in which the fifth anniversary of the Veteran's death occurs if you have not already reached the limitations described.

The Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) is a Federal tax credit incentive that Congress provides to private-sector businesses for hiring individuals from nine target groups who have consistently faced significant barriers to employment. The main objective of this program is to enable the targeted employees to gradually move from economic dependency into self-sufficiency as they earn a steady income and become contributing taxpayers, while the participating employers are compensated by being able to reduce their federal income tax liability. WOTC joins other workforce programs that help incentivize workplace diversity and facilitate access to good jobs for American workers.

**Missouri Linked Deposit Program**

The Missouri Linked Deposit Program is a low-interest loan program administered by the State Treasurer’s Office and Missouri financial institutions. The financial institutions receive low-interest rate deposits from the State Treasurer for certain eligible programs, and pass on the interest savings to approved borrowers. Since the loans are not guaranteed by the State or grants, borrowers must meet the credit requirements of the lending institution.

**Waivers for Dissolved Corporations due to Military Service**

The Secretary of State will waive reinstatement fees and procedures in the event a corporation was administratively dissolved for failure to file an annual registration report when the failure was due to the business owner's active military service. The Secretary of State will waive all late fees, cancel the certificate of dissolution, and reinstate the corporation in these circumstances. Annual registration report fees may still be due for the years in which no report was filed.

**Certain Business Fees Waived for Guard & Active Duty Members**

If a specified organizer, majority shareholder, officer, director, or partner of a company, corporation, health services corporation, nonprofit corporation, cooperative company, or partnership is a member of the Missouri National Guard or any other active duty member of the military, resides in Missouri, and provides proof of service to the Secretary of State, certain specified business fees will be waived. ### **Professional License Extensions due to Military Service**

A person whose job requires licensing or certification by the State of Missouri who is called to active duty in the National Guard or any Reserve Component of the Armed Services will not be required to attend the continuing education or training required to maintain the licensing or certification during the time of active duty. Upon returning from active duty the person will not have to make up or retake any training or education missed during that time.

### **Military Experience Allowed for Professional License Qualifications**

All professional licensing boards or commissions of the State of Missouri shall accept education, training, or service completed by an individual who is a member of the United States armed forces, reserves, or national guard toward the qualifications to receive the license or certification upon presentation of satisfactory evidence by an applicant for certification or licensure.

### **Licensure and Certification Test Costs**

Licensing and certification tests can be paid for by VA benefits. A licensing test is a test offered by a state, local or federal agency required by law to practice an occupation. A certification test is a test designed to provide an affirmation of an individual's qualifications in a specified occupation. Certification is not required to practice an occupation except where the occupational licensing requirements include certification as part of those requirements. ### **Health Related Professional License Renewal While on Active Duty**

When a person with a health-related professional license or certificate in good standing by the State of Missouri is called to active duty, their license or certificate will remain in good standing for the duration of active duty. Renewal of the license or certificate while the person is on active duty shall occur without the payment of dues. Continuing education will also not be required if certain requirements are met. The existing license or certificate issued shall be continued as long as the person is a member of the United States armed forces on active duty and for a period of at least six months after being released from active duty.

**Courtesy Professional Licenses for Non-Resident Military Spouses**

Any state agency or board that regulates an occupation or profession must establish criteria for the issuance of a temporary courtesy license to a nonresident spouse of an active duty member of the military who has been transferred to Missouri allowing the spouse to lawfully practice his or her occupation or profession in this state provided certain qualifications are met.

A war on terror Veteran may be entitled to a weekly benefit for 26 weeks with the dollar amount based on eight percent of the highest wages paid to the Veteran in the five calendar quarters prior to deployment. The maximum benefit amount a Veteran can receive is \$1,153.64.

Individuals who quit work to relocate due to their spouses’ military change of station (i.e., trailing military spouses) are potentially eligible for unemployment benefits. If a trailing military spouse quits work to relocate to a residence from which it is impractical to commute to the workplace and remains employed as long as reasonable prior to the move, he or she may be eligible for unemployment benefits, so long as he or she meets other unemployment eligibility criteria

Veterans, Guard members, Reservists or a dependent of a Veteran may be eligible to receive a monthly educational benefit from the VA.

On-the-Job Training (OJT) is received while performing a job and earning wages. OJT programs must be at least six months and up to two years in length. Apprenticeship Training is on-the-job training, with 144 hours (minimum) per year of related technical instruction. You receive your GI Bill benefit while working full time and earning wages.

**Veterans' Preference for Employment by the State of Missouri**

Missouri Veterans receive a five-point preference when testing for Merit System positions with the state, with a ten point preference for a service-connected disabled Veteran. This preference may not be available at non-Merit state agencies. Spouses of eligible Veterans can also qualify for Veterans Preference for State testing. For non-Merit agencies, it is recommended you contact the non-merit agency of interest and ask them directly if/how Veterans Preference works in their agency.

**Priority for Qualified Veterans Employment by the State**

State agencies which administer federally funded employment and training programs for Veterans shall give priority to qualified Veterans and other eligible persons.

Several benefits are provided to state employees who are Veterans or are deployed. Veterans may be eligible to purchase up to four years of active duty military service credit performed prior to your last becoming a member of MOSERS. This includes active duty military training. If you elect to purchase your active duty military service, you must purchase all that you served (total months and days) up to a maximum of four years.

State employees who are called to active duty may receive credit for active duty military service. They can also continue to have life insurance coverage for one year and long-term disability coverage for one year provided they continue to pay for the coverage.

**Time off for Civil Air Patrol & Coast Guard Auxiliary Duties**

Any State employee or employee of a business with more than 50 workers and who is a member of the Civil Air Patrol or the United States Coast Guard Auxiliary may be granted a leave of absence without loss of time, pay, regular leave, negative ratings, or any other rights or benefits entitled when performing duties for CAP or USCG for up to 15 days in any fiscal year, or unlimited time in response to state or national emergencies in Missouri. The Missouri Veterans Commission Homes Program operates seven exemplary Veterans Homes whose mission is to ‘honor and serve the Veterans whose dedication and sacrifice have preserved our nation and its freedoms’.

The Missouri Veterans Homes operates a total of 1,350 beds that provide long term skilled nursing care in compliance with 158 Federal Department of Veterans Affairs regulations. The Homes are located in Cameron, Cape Girardeau, Mexico, Mount Vernon, St. James, St. Louis, and Warrensburg.


Each Missouri Veterans Home employs a licensed nursing home administrator, has registered nurses on duty 24 hours per day, and provides physician care; physical, speech, occupational and recreational therapy; medications; cosmetology; maintenance, environmental and social services, and dietary specialists. Each home has a secured dementia unit that includes a dining room, activity area and enclosed courtyard.

The monthly resident charge is calculated using a sliding scale based on the Veteran’s ability to pay.

To be eligible for admission to a Missouri Veterans Home (RSMo Chapter 42), a Veteran during his or her lifetime must have lived in Missouri for 180 days, meet the criteria for Veteran status established by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, and require skilled nursing services. Eligibility and admission decisions are made by a team comprised of the Administrator, Physician, Director of Nursing, Social Worker, Veterans Service Officer, and other professionals as needed.

Unless otherwise prohibited by law, a homeless Veteran may use a charitable, religious, fraternal, or Veterans organization as a substitute mailing address to receive state or federal assistance if the organizations meet the following:

- The purpose of the organizations is to provide charitable, religious, fraternal, or Veterans services
- The organizations have been providing these services for more than 10 years
- The organizations are willing to be the substitute address for the homeless Veteran.

### **Free Criminal Background Checks for Homeless Veterans Employment**

The Missouri State Highway Patrol, as the designated Missouri State Identification Bureau, will provide at no cost a criminal background check in connection with gaining employment, housing, or any other service on any homeless former member of the armed forces who has been honorably discharged.

A Veteran who is incarcerated may not be aware of the services and programs that the VA and the Missouri Veterans Commission can provide or coordinate prior to and after leaving prison.

The Incarcerated Veterans Re-Entry Program (IVREP) assists incarcerated Veterans and their families with information and assistance on VA benefits, transitioning back into the community, and works with incarcerated Veterans to reduce the number of VA overpayments while incarcerated.

Incarcerated Veterans nearing release in three to six months can be referred to a Veterans Service Officer in the community where they will be living who will be able to assist them with their VA benefits.

The IVREP works by linking qualified Veterans with the appropriate services. The goal of the IVREP is to assist in the successful transition back to a productive and healthy lifestyle among community and family.

## Driver Documents

### Motorcycle Driving Exam Exemption

An Active Duty Member of the U.S. Armed Forces who successfully completes a military motorcycle rider training course that meets or exceeds the Motorcycle Safety Foundation curriculum standards will not be required to take further driving tests to obtain a motorcycle or motortricycle license or endorsement.

### Commercial Driver Exam (CDL) Exemptions

Missouri allows active duty military or retired military personnel to complete an application for waiver of skills testing to obtain a commercial driver license. Applicant must have a minimum of 60 days active duty driving experience in a commercial motor vehicle for the military (not vehicle training) within the 2 years prior to date of application for waiver. Applicants must still complete the required knowledge examinations for the commercial driver license class being applied for. The application is available on-line or may be faxed upon request or acquired at a local license office.

**Veterans Identification on Driver’s License or State I.D. Card**

A Veteran may apply to the Department of Revenue to obtain a state driver’s license or identification card showing Veteran designation.

A Veteran must provide their DD-214 showing a discharge status of “honorable,” “general,” or “under honorable conditions” or a United States Uniformed Services Identification Card (DD Form 2), that includes a discharge status of “retired” or “reserve retired” and pay the authorized fees for the license or card.

**NOTE:** Less than 1% of Veterans may have a document other than the DD-214 which the National Personnel Records Center, the Department of Defense and the United States Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) recognize as an equivalent document for the DD214. If you do not have a DD-214, you should send a copy of your documentation and contact information to the Missouri Veterans Commission at :

The Veterans Commission will review the documentation and determine if the documents meet the criteria as an equivalent document for the DD214 and issue an equivalency letter to you. Upon receipt, you may take the letter to a license office and apply for the Veteran Designation on your driver license or nondriver identification card.



### **Renewal of Driver Documents**

Missouri allows for an early renewal of driver licenses, permits, or non-driver licenses documents for persons leaving the state or country. An applicant can apply for early renewal at a local license office prior to leaving to ensure the document does not expire while deployed.

Missouri allows renewal by mail for members of the armed forces and their dependents. Applicants should submit renewal form DOR-4317 (available on-line at [www.dor.mo.gov](http://www.dor.mo.gov) or faxed upon request), along with required documents and fees.

Any Missouri resident upon active duty discharge from the military will have 90 days after re-establishment of residence within the state or 6 months from the date of discharge, whichever is sooner, to renew an expired driver's license without taking the full examination. The expired license is not valid for driving.

### **Driver License Suspensions & Revocations to be Stayed**

Missouri has a process for driver license suspensions and revocations to be stayed in certain cases for members of the armed forces on active duty. The suspensions and revocations will remain in a stayed status until sixty days after the military service ends. For information on how to get your license reinstated or to find out what is on your driver record call (573) 526-2407. You may also access the Missouri Driver Guide on-line.

# Vehicle Documents

## Vehicle Registration Renewal and Required Documents

Military applicants may renew an expired motor vehicle registration up to 60 days after completion of military service without a renewal penalty. The vehicle may not be operated during the period the registration is expired. The applicant must submit official orders from the appropriate military authority as evidence of military service and date of discharge.

## Titling and Inspections

Military applicants may authorize another individual to sign the General Affidavit (DOR-768) indicating the vehicle is out-of-state and will be inspected within ten days of returning to Missouri, if applicable. Power of attorney or a statement from the military applicant allowing the signature is not required.

Military applicants are allowed 180 days from completion of military service before a title penalty is assessed on the purchase of a motor vehicle, trailer, boat, outboard motor, all terrain vehicle, or manufactured home. Military applicants may have a commissioned officer or other out-of-state law enforcement officer sign an inspection form to verify the vehicle identification number (VIN) and odometer reading of a vehicle previously titled out of state (ID/OD inspection).

## Extensions

Any person engaged in the performance of active duty in a U. S. military conflict for 30 days or more, will receive an extension for complying with certain motor vehicle laws. Qualified military service includes:

- A member of the National Guard or National Guard Reserve;
- A member of the United States Armed Forces or Reserve (Army, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, or Marines); and
- An officer of the United States Public Health Service detailed by proper authority for duty with any branch of the United States Armed Forces.

Active duty military personnel who sell a vehicle and are deployed before a new vehicle can be purchased are allowed an extension of 180 days after return to purchase a vehicle and obtain the tax allowance. A copy of their military orders of completion of deployment must be submitted. This extension also applies to “total loss” vehicle tax credits.

Missouri has over 30 different types of military and veteran personalized license plates available to qualified individuals. To preview these specialty plates or read the requirements to obtain them, visit the Missouri Department of Revenue at the above website. Examples include, but are not limited to: Air Force, Navy, Operation Enduring Freedom, National Guard, Coast Guard, Marine Corps, Civil Air Patrol, Army, Purple Heart, Some Gave All, U.S. Veteran, Operation Iraqi Freedom, Legion of Merit.

Any surviving spouse of an individual who would have been eligible to obtain a United States Armed Forces, Coast Guard, Merchant Marines, Reserves, Missouri National Guard, or United States Marine Corps League special license plate may obtain the plate as long as the spouse does not remarry.



### **Certification Renewal Exemption for Disabled Plates & Placards.**

A person who presents proof of permanent disability from the United States Veterans Administration is exempt from the four-year certification requirement for renewal of disabled license plates or placards. Initial applications must include a physician's statement confirming the individual's disability.

### **Property Tax Receipt Waiver for Out of State Military**

Military applicants who did not receive their renewal notice and are stationed outside of the state of Missouri are eligible for waiver of their property tax receipt verification requirement if the applicant provides a Leave and Earnings Statement which does NOT indicate Missouri as his or her home of record.

### **Liability Insurance Discontinuation**

Active duty military applicants may discontinue liability insurance on a vehicle with an otherwise valid registration, provided that the vehicle is not being operated.

### **Free Parking for Certain Veterans**

Upon the approval of a local authority's governing body, a Veteran displaying a Congressional Medal of Honor, Prisoner of War, Silver Star, or Purple Heart specialty license plate may park his or her motor vehicle without charge in a metered parking space within the authority's jurisdiction if it is less than 6,000 pounds gross weight. A Veteran who has been awarded the Bronze Star may apply to the Director of the Department of Revenue for a windshield placard which will allow him or her to also park without charge in a metered parking space if the placard is hung from the front, middle rearview mirror or displayed on the dashboard on the driver's side if there is no rearview mirror. Certain vehicle and parking restrictions are specified.

## **Marriage License for Out of State Military**

If one of the applicants for a marriage license has been called or ordered to active military duty out of the state or country, the recorder of deeds may issue a license if an affidavit or sworn statement is submitted by the military applicant on a form furnished by the recorder of deeds which includes the necessary information for the recorder of deeds to issue a marriage license.

The military applicant must attest that she or he has been called or ordered to active military duty out of the state or country, which will be verified by the military applicant's military officer and acknowledged by a notary public.

**Free Fishing License for Disabled Missouri Veterans**

Any honorably discharged military Veteran having a service-related disability of sixty percent (60%) or greater, or who was a prisoner of war during military service, may take fish, live bait, clams, mussels, turtles, and frogs as provided in Chapter 6 without permit (except trout permit or daily tag in areas where prescribed), provided, while fishing, s/he carries a certified statement of eligibility from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

**Free Hunting License for Disabled Missouri Veterans**

Any honorably discharged military Veteran having a service-related disability of sixty percent (60%) or greater, or who was a prisoner of war during military service, may take wildlife as provided in Chapter 7 without permit (except deer and turkey hunting permits and the Migratory Bird Hunting Permit and Conservation Order Permit as prescribed); provided, while hunting, s/he carries a certified statement of eligibility from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

**Resident Permit privileges for Permanent Change of Station**

All members of the United States armed forces stationed and residing in Missouri on permanent change of station status, and their immediate families residing with them, may receive resident permit privileges.

**Resident Permit Eligibility for Out of State Disabled Veterans**

Any honorably discharged military Veteran having a service-related disability of sixty percent (60%) or greater, or who was a prisoner of war during military service, may purchase resident permits; provided, while purchasing and exercising permit privileges such person must carry a certified statement of eligibility from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

## Guard and Reserve Small Game Hunting & Fishing Permit

For residents of Missouri who are currently, or have in the previous twelve (12) months, been mobilized and serving on full-time active military duty in either the National Guard (in Federal Status) or Reserve forces of the United States to chase, pursue, take, possess and transport fish, frogs, mussels, clams, turtles, crayfish, live bait, birds (except wild turkey) and mammals (except deer), and to sell furbearers taken by hunting.

Fee: five dollars (\$5).

### Conservation area accessibility

The Department of Conservation is working to remove barriers that prevent people with disabilities from enjoying the outdoors. Throughout the state, construction of new facilities and renovations at older properties are providing access to Conservation Department areas, buildings, and shooting ranges.

This program allows for interstate and state-numbered highway interchanges to be designated for Missouri residents who were in the armed forces and had been killed in action on or after September 11, 2001 in either Afghanistan or Iraq while serving the military. The memorial signs will be installed within the interchange on the right side of the highway, one sign per each travel direction. The current fee for two standard (6' x 3') signs is \$2,400 due with submission of the application.



### **Flags at Half-Staff**

The United States flag and the Missouri state flag are flown at half-staff on all government buildings for one full day, as determined by the Governor, whenever a Missouri resident and member of the military forces is killed in the line of duty.

### **Museum of Missouri Military History**

Located at the Ike Skelton Training Center, this museum houses exhibits beginning from 1808, the activation date of the Missouri Militia. Exhibits continue from the War of 1812 to the Global War on Terror. The building that houses the collection was built in the 1920s and used as a self-contained dormitory for prisoners working the dairy farm. Closed all major holidays. Free admission.

Beginning January 1, 2016, all military retirement pension income will be tax free from Missouri Income Tax.

As of January 1, 2011, any citizen of Missouri who is a former Prisoner of War as defined by law, and who has a total service-connected disability, shall be exempt from owing taxes on all real property used as a homestead as defined by law.

## **Missouri State Income Tax Exemption for Active Duty Members**

Any military income earned as compensation for being a member of the active duty component of the armed forces may be deducted from the person's Missouri adjusted gross income to determine that individual's Missouri taxable income.

## **Property Tax Receipt Waiver for Out of State Military**

## **Personal Property Tax Credit**

The Missouri Property Tax Credit Claim gives credit to certain senior citizens and 100 percent disabled individuals for a portion of the real estate taxes or rent paid for the year. The credit is for a maximum of \$750 for renters and \$1,100 for owners who owned and occupied their home. The actual credit is based on the amount of real estate taxes or rent paid and total household income (taxable and nontaxable). If you rent from a facility that does not pay property taxes, you are not eligible for a Property Tax Credit.

## **Sales Tax Exemption for Equipment to Modify Vehicles for Use by Individuals with Disabilities**

Equipment purchased to modify a vehicle so that it can be used by an individual with disabilities is exempt from sales tax. To receive the exemption, the applicant when titling the vehicle at Department of Revenue or a License Office must present an invoice or other documentation showing the vehicle and equipment price separately in order for the equipment to be exempt. Specifically, 144.030.2(18), RSMo provides an exemption for "items used solely to modify motor vehicles to permit the use of such motor vehicles by individuals with disabilities."



TRICARE is the Department of Defense's worldwide health care program available to eligible beneficiaries from any of the seven uniformed services—the U.S. Army, U.S. Navy, U.S. Air Force, U.S. Marine Corps, U.S. Coast Guard, Commissioned Corps of the U.S. Public Health Service, and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. Eligibility for TRICARE is determined by information in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS). It is important for sponsors to keep DEERS records up to date. For eligibility, enrollment, cost, and coverage details, visit [www.tricare.mil](http://www.tricare.mil) or contact your regional contractor.

TRICARE beneficiaries can be divided into two main categories: sponsors and family members. Sponsors are usually active duty service members, National Guard/Reserve members or retired service members. "Sponsor," refers to the person who is serving or who has served on active duty or in the National Guard or Reserves.

Depending on your beneficiary category and location, you may be eligible for different program options. Your options may change if you move, if your sponsor changes location or status, or if you have a life event such as getting married or becoming entitled to Medicare Part A. For assistance with health care coverage when moving or traveling, contact your regional contractor.

TRICARE in Missouri falls under the TRICARE West Region except for the St. Louis area which is under TRICARE North Region.

If you are a service member, retiree, or dependent, DEERS registration is the key to getting your TRICARE benefits eligibility established.

### **Registration in DEERS**

Eligibility for TRICARE is determined by the uniformed services and reported to the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS). All eligible beneficiaries must have their eligibility status recorded in DEERS.

Active-duty and retired service members are automatically registered in DEERS, but they must take action to register their family members and ensure they're correctly entered into the database. Mistakes in the DEERS database can cause problems with TRICARE claims, so it is critical to maintain your DEERS information.

### **ID Cards**

To use TRICARE, you must be registered in DEERS and have a valid uniformed services or military identification (ID) card. The ID card states on the back, in the "Medical" block, whether you are eligible for medical care from military or civilian sources.

When getting care, your provider will ask to see a copy of your ID card and will make copies for his or her records. Please ensure you have your ID card with you whenever you are getting care or having prescriptions filled

## Missouri Military and Overseas Voting Access Portal

Missouri wants to ensure voting is as easy and efficient as possible for members of our military and their families. Now, military and overseas voters will be able to take advantage of the Missouri Military and Overseas Voting Access Portal, which they can use to register to vote, request an absentee ballot, and receive an absentee ballot quickly and securely.

Using the Missouri Military and Overseas Voting Access Portal, eligible voters who submit an absentee ballot request through the portal will receive an absentee ballot for each election in which absentee voting is conducted through December 31 of the following year. Voters located in combat zone, hostile fire or imminent danger areas will also be able to securely send their marked ballots to their local election authority.

**Eligibility:** A member of the U.S. Uniformed Services, which includes the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard and the Commissioned Corps of the Public Health Service and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration; a member of the U.S. merchant marines; Spouses and dependents of the above; a U.S. citizen domiciled in Missouri but temporarily living outside the territorial limits of the United States. Missouri requires voters to be registered at least thirty days prior to an election in order to vote a full ballot (includes local and state issues). Military and overseas voters are also welcome to use the regular registration and absentee mail process available to all voters away from home on Election Day.

### Registering to Vote After Deadline

If you have been discharged from military service, have returned from a military deployment or activation, or have separated from employment outside the territorial limits of the United States after the deadline to register to vote, and are otherwise qualified to register to vote, you may register to vote in person before the election authority until 5:00 p.m. on the Friday before the election, providing documentation showing evidence of qualifying for late registration. You may also vote on Election Day without prior registration, for federal and state issues at your polling place with a federal postcard application. For eligibility requirements call 573-751-2301.

### Candidate Filing for Elections while on Active Duty

A candidate on active duty with the armed forces may have a representative draw for his or her placement on an election ballot. Previously, the candidate had to draw for placement on the ballot in person.

Women Veterans initiatives ensures that Women Veterans have equitable access to federal and state Veterans services and ensure Women Veterans are aware of their VA benefits, know who to contact, and how to apply for these benefits.
